American Legion National High School Oratorical Scholarship – Applicant may be any high school, junior high school, or state accredited home school (public, private, parochial or military) in grades 9-12. Applicant shall be a citizen of or resident of the US, enrolled in school and under the age of twenty (20). State Award is \$1,500 to \$3,000. National Award is \$14,000 to \$18,000. Aspire Award – Applicant must be a Tennessee senior who plans to attend a Tennessee 2-year or 4-year college. Applicant must be eligible for the Tennessee HOPE Scholarship. Parent's adjusted gross income must not exceed \$36,000. Award is up to \$2,250 per year. FAFSA IS THE APPLICATION. (www.fafsa.ed.gov)

AT&T Foundation Employee Scholarship – Applicant must be a child or stepchild of an active employee of AT&T, Inc. Student must also be planning to enroll in a 2-year or 4-year college. Award amount varies. Deadline is unknown at this time. (www.scholarshipamerica.org/attfoundation).

AXA Achievement Scholarship -- Applicants must be US citizens; be current high school seniors who plan to enroll full-time in an accredited two-year or four-year college or university; and demonstrate ambition and self-drive as evidenced by outstanding achievement in an activity in school, the community or workplace. (DAR) Ellen Davies Rodgers/Zachariah Davies Scholarship – Applicant must be a U.S. citizen and current resident of Tennessee entering freshman year in an accredited program at a 4-year college precluding junior colleges and vocational schools. Award amount is \$750. Applications will be available in the Counseling Office. Deadline is unknown at this time.

(DAR) NSDAR Scholarships - Applicants must be citizens of the United States and plan to attend an accredited college or university in the United States. The various DAR Scholarships each have different requirements and procedures which must be followed to apply. Award amounts vary. Deadlines are unknown at this time (www.DAR.org.)

(DAR) TSDAR American History Scholarship – Applicant must be a senior who will be attending an accredited college/university, who will have a concentrated study of a minimum of 24 credit hours in American History and American Government. Award amount is \$1,000. Applications will be available in the Counseling Office. Deadline is unknown at this time.

(DAR) TSDAR Scholarship – Applicant must be a U.S. citizen and a current resident of Tennessee who will be entering his/her freshman year in an accredited college/university granting a degree. This may be a nursing school or junior college, but not a vocational school. Award amount is \$2,500. Applications will be available in the Counseling Office. Deadline is unknown at this time.

DBI Scholarship – Applicant must be a senior who plans to attend a vocational-technical school, 2-year college, or 4-year college. Applicant must be the child of a current employee of Ingram Entertainment, Inc. or DBI Distributing, Inc., with at least two years of service. Applicant must have a 3.0 GPA. Award amount is unknown. Dixie Boys/Bernie Varnadore Scholarship- Applicant must be a senior who participated at one time in a franchised Dixie Boys Baseball, Inc. program and plans to attend a college or university. Grades, evidence of strong school and community leadership and a financial need are considered. Award amount is \$1,250. Applications will be available in the Counseling Office and online. Deadline is April 1st. (baseball.dixie.org)

Dixie Softball Scholarship – Applicant must be a female senior who participated for at least two years in a Dixie Softball Summer Program. Financial need and academic achievement are considered. 6 \$1500 scholarships will be given. Applications will be available in the Counseling Office. Deadline is unknown at this time. Dixie Youth Baseball Scholarship- Applicant must be a senior who has participated in a Dixie Youth Baseball program. Financial need will be a factor in determining award recipients. Please be aware-NCAA rules may prohibit acceptance of this scholarship if you will be participating in an athletic program in college. Award amount is \$2,000. G. H. Weems Educational Fund Scholarship – Applicant must be a senior who plans to attend a 4-year college. Applicant must have at least a 2.5 GPA and at least a 19 on the ACT. Grote Chemistry Scholarship UTC – Applicant must be a future UTC chemistry major who has been accepted for freshman admission for the fall semester immediately after graduation. Scholarships range in value from \$5,000 to \$20,000. Apply online. Deadline is unknown at this time. (www.horatioalger.org/scholarships)

Horatio Alger National Career & Technical Scholarship Program – Applicant must be a senior planning to attend a career or technical degree/certificate granting program. Applicant must also be Pell Grant eligible. Award amount is up to \$2,500. Deadline is unknown at this time. (application.horatioalger.org)

Humphreys County Education Association Scholarship – Applicant must be a senior who has exhibited high moral character, exemplary scholastic achievement, and a desire to enter the field of education. Applicant must enter a 2-year or 4-year college with a major in elementary or secondary education. Award is for \$300. Deadline is unknown at this time. John F. Kennedy Profile in Courage Essay Contest – Participant must be a U.S. high school student in grades 9-12. Participants must write an original and creative essay of less than 1,000 words that demonstrates an understanding of political courage as described by JFK in *Profiles in Courage*. Awards range from \$500 to \$10,000. Deadline is unknown at this time. (www.jfklibrary.org)

Juliann and Joseph Maxwell Scholarship -- Those eligible for this scholarship are high school seniors, college freshmen, sophomores, and juniors who are dependent children, including adopted and stepchildren, of full-time and part-time employees of Tractor Supply Company. Employees must have a minimum of one year of service with Tractor Supply Company by January 1 of the year in which the application is received. Use the Community Foundation of Middle Tennessee Scholarship Application. Deadline is March 15th. (www.cfmt.org)

Lakeside Employees Credit Union Excellence Scholarship – Applicant must be any Humphreys County high school senior with a minimum 3.0 GPA who plans to attend a 2-year college, 4-year college, or vocational school. Award is \$500. Applications will be available in the Counseling Office. Deadline is unknown at this time.

Lloyd Bowman, Sr. Memorial Scholarship – Applicant must be a senior with an MHS 2.75 or higher who is planning to attend a college, university or technical/training school. Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation – Applicant must be a senior, with a GPA of at least 2.0. The applicant's family adjusted gross income must be \$96,000 or less. Applicant must be the child of one of the following: (1) Active duty or reserve U.S. Marine (2) Veteran U.S. Marine who has received an honorable discharge, or who was killed while serving in the U.S. Marine Corps; (3) Active duty or reserve U.S. Navy Corpsman who is serving, or has served, with the U.S. Marine unit; or (4) Veteran U.S. Navy Corpsman who served with a U.S. Marine unit and has received an honorable discharge, or was killed while serving in the U.S. Navy as a Corpsman attached to a Marine unit. Awards range from \$500-\$10,000. Deadline for applicants planning to attend a 2-year or 4-year college/university is March 1st. MG James Ursano Scholarship – Applicant must be dependent child, stepchild, or legally adopted child of Army soldier on active duty, retired, or deceased while on active duty. The children of Gray Area Retirees are also eligible. Applicant must be registered in the Defense Eligibility Enrollment Reporting System (DEERS). You can check your status at 800-538-9552. Applicant must be unmarried for the entire academic year. He/she must also be under the age of 23. Awards range from \$900-\$1900 per year. Deadline is unknown at this time. (www.aerhq.org)

Middle Tennessee Nursery Association (MTNA) Scholarship – Applicant must be a Middle Tennessee senior who plans to major in a horticulture-related area at a 2-year or 4-year college. Award is \$1500. Deadline is unknown at this time. (www.mtna.com)

Military Order of the Purple Heart Scholarship – Applicant must be a direct descendant of a Purple Heart recipient, a veteran killed in action, or a veteran who died of wounds; must be a US citizen; must be a graduating senior; must have at least a 2.75 GPA; must plan to attend a vocational-technical school, 2-year college, or 4-year college. Award is \$3,000. Deadline is unknown at this time. (www.purpleheart.org/scholarships)

Mitsui USA Scholarships Program – Applicant must be a senior who is a U.S. citizen or permanent resident; who has been a resident of TN for the past five years; and who has an un-weighted, cumulative GPA of B (3.0) or better.
